

## Maximum width using CSS

I recently found a neat CSS property when i was surfing the web. You can use the max-width style attribute to define a maximum width for a div or a table or other css object.

```
usage:  
style="max-width: 200px;"  
or  
.myclass{  
max-width: 200px;  
}
```

This (ofcourse) will not work in Internet Explorer. To get the same in IE, use:

```
width:expression(document.body.clientWidth > 200? "200px": "auto" );
```

So, for something that works in a lot of browsers, use:

```
.myclass{  
max-width: 200px;  
width:expression(200 + "px");  
}
```
